Millavec Lake Aeration

The aeration system at Millavec Lake has been fully operational for 2 months now and you can already see a tremendous difference in the water! The system was installed to help overcome algae growth and to provide a healthy environment for the fish to live in. Sediment has accumulated on the bottom of the lake for years, and it is unknown exactly how long it may take to "turn the lake over". This means the water from the bottom of the lake has to be pushed to the surface of the lake to help slow the growth of algae and moss. While the diffusers will certainly assist in slowing the algae blooms, there may still be occasional occurrences. The good news is that it has helped produce excellent fishing, so grab your tackle box and get ready to catch a beauty!



Farmers for NISP

The July 15th Ag Rally for the Northern Integrated Supply Project (NISP) clearly demonstrated the overwhelming support farmers and ag related businesses have for NISP. Over 200 people attended the event at Anderson Farms west of Frederick to voice their support and gather information about the proposed NISP project that would provide 40,000 acre-feet of water to Frederick and 14 other water suppliers in Northern Colorado. NISP participants would fund the construction of Glade Reservoir north of Fort Collins and Galeton Reservoir northeast of Greeley. These reservoirs would be used to store water from the Cache la Poudre River and South Platte River that would otherwise flow unused out of Colorado.



Carbon Valley Transit Study

Frederick, Firestone and Dacono received a grant and will cooperatively oversee a feasibility study to determine what transportation needs exist in the Carbon Valley region and then develop a plan to most efficiently meet those needs. The first phase of the study will include surveys and meetings to gather information about individual needs and desires related to transportation. Please watch for and take advantage of opportunities to share your specific thoughts about transportation in our region. Your input will determine if, when and how transit services are needed in our community.
