## TOWN PROJECTS

October is National Community Planning Month. Our Planning Department has been busy this year with improvements in our Town parks! The Frederick Recreation Area (8201 Colorado Blvd.) is our most popular park with updates and new amenities. Located near the southeast corner, you have more room to fetch in the extended Canine Corral Dog Park. Next, step on over to the new fitness court for a free, outdoor workout. The court features seven functional training zones and thousands of bodyweight exercises for people of all ages and abilities. Plus, there's an app for that! The long-awaited skate park running alongside Godding Hollow is nearing completion. When the fence is removed, you are free to skate, scooter, bike and blade this world-class facility built by Team Pain! In the Coalridge neighborhood, the playground at 301 Warwick Street was removed and replaced with new equipment.

There's a new structure fit for ages two to five years and a much taller one (two stories high!) for kids of all ages. ## FALL CLEAN UP PROGRAM

If you're feeling the urge to tidy up, we've added convenient options to our Fall Clean Up Day program! Town of Frederick residents can use a voucher for one free trip to the Front Range Landfill (1830 Weld County Road 5, Erie, CO 80516) between October 15 to November 14. You can pick up the official voucher at Town Hall (401 Locust Street) between 9 am to 4 pm starting Monday, October 5. This perk is for Frederick residents only. Be sure to bring your ID along with your utility bill as proof of residency. Seniors 65 and over who cannot take their items to the landfill can call Public Works no later than October 9 at 720.382.5800 to request a curbside pickup. Our Public Works team will coordinate the curbside pickup for senior items on October 14, 15 or 16. Do you have electronics to recycle? Public Works is offering free electronics recycling on October 15, 16 and 17. How about tree limbs? We now provide tree limb disposal throughout the year!
