CodeRED is the address specific emergency notification system Weld County uses to help law and fire agencies send emergency information such as evacuation, lockdown, and shelter-in-place notifications. You can also opt-in to receive address specific weather warnings from the National Weather Service. Already registered? Great! Take a minute to review your registered information and make any updates needed. ## ELECTION RESULTS

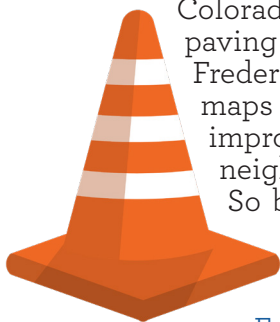
Thank you for voting on what matters! The official results for the Town of Frederick 2022 regular municipal election held on April 5 were certified on April 15. Incumbents Dan March and Windi Padia and newcomer Chad teVelde were sworn in as Trustees at the April 26 Board meeting. Mayor Tracie Crites announced, “The electors in Frederick made it clear today that they support our mission of building a community that is ‘Built on What Matters’ by voting. I welcome our newly elected Trustees to carry on the Board’s collaboration to create a resident focused, amenity strong, and financially secure community. ## ROADWORK AHEAD!

You may have noticed more roadwork projects this year. Through resident feedback and using the Transportation Master Plan to guide priorities, the Board of Trustees approved over \$4 million in the 2022 budget for capital improvement roadwork projects, including mill and overlay work in Wyndham Hill, Raspberry Hill, and Colorado Boulevard (between Tipple and Bella Rosa). Other big projects in the works this year include improvements at the Colorado and Tipple intersection and paving two alleyways in Downtown Frederick. In addition, you can see maps with pavement maintenance improvements planned for your neighborhood on our website.

## MAYORS MESSAGE

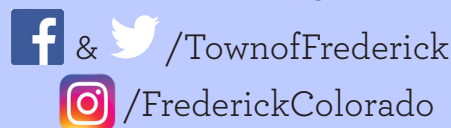

## YOUR UTILITY BILL

The Town of Frederick has upgraded financial software and is no longer using Xpress Bill Pay. The new system is called [Municipal Online Payments](#). What does this mean to you? If you paid your bill online, had automatic online payments, or paid through your bank bill pay, you may need to update your information with your NEW ten-digit account number (look at your last bill mailed to all customers). You can pay your bill with a debit or credit card through the new Municipal Online Payment system. This system does not allow electronic checks (you cannot link your account using your routing number and checking account information). Contact your bank directly if you would like to use this type of auto-pay, as many banks give account holders the option to pay bills through banking bill pay. If you already do this, update your Town of Frederick bank bill pay with your new 10-digit account number to ensure your payment is applied to the correct service address. You have many options to pay your bill: Online, through your bank, or phone. We also accept cash or check by mail, drive-thru, drop box, or in-person!
