Frederick, Colorado

The Town of Frederick is ideally located in the northern Front Range, halfway between Denver and Fort Collins. Frederick rests on two prime transportation corridors, Interstate 25 and Highway 52, which provide easy access to the nearby municipalities of Denver, Longmont, Boulder, and Fort Collins. This strategic location helps the Town access one of the strongest labor pools in the region.

Frederick boasts one of the fastest-growing populations in the State of Colorado. The Town is proud to be home to over 16,000 residents, who comprise a young, educated, and talented workforce. The Town of Frederick's priority is to ensure that growth results in a cohesive community that preserves a small-town atmosphere while embracing the amenities and opportunities accompanying new development.

Transportation

The Town of Frederick is centrally located with quick and convenient access to the Denver Metro area and the entire northern Front Range.

Airports

- Denver International Airport (DEN) is a 28-minute drive from Frederick. DEN offers non-stop service to over 180 destinations, including London, England; Frankfurt, Germany; Tokyo, Japan; Reykjavik, Iceland; and Dublin, Ireland. As of 2024, DEN is the third busiest airport in the US and the sixth busiest in the world.
- Rocky Mountain Metropolitan Airport is a 21-minute drive from Frederick. Colorado's fourth busiest airport offers U.S. Customs and private charter services.

I-25 Improvements

- The addition of managed lanes on I-25 has expanded capacity into Frederick from the south. As CDOT continues to add infrastructure to the north, traffic flow, access and capacity to adjacent communities will continue to improve.
- The Intersection of I-25 and Highway 52 is one of the busiest intersections in northern Colorado, with I-25 alone seeing over 100k vehicle trips per day through the Town of Frederick.

Boulder

- The City of Boulder is only a 22 mile drive from Frederick. Boulder is home to the University of Colorado, numerous federal laboratories, and various industry sectors that support and complement Frederick's business community.

Public Transportation

- Frederick is conveniently located with nearby access to RTD's metro-wide bus system, including service to DEN. This includes access to FlexRide, a service providing nearby curb-to-curb transportation.
- Bustang, a regional transportation service, provides access from Ft. Collins to Denver with a stop at HWY 119 currently under construction and set to be completed by August 2024.
- In October 2021, the Town began to offer services through Via Mobility, which provides transportation services to the elderly and disabled living in the Town. This service helps residents maintain independence by transporting them to medical appointments, therapy, grocery stores, employment, and social events.

Northwest Parkway/E-470

- This beltway is a nine-minute drive away from Frederick. The toll route provides unobstructed and quick access to the Denver Metro area, including DEN.

Characteristics of the Local Economy

Frederick is privileged to host nearly 400 businesses, including small, family-owned companies, service providers, high-tech manufacturers, and national headquarters. The chart (right) summarizes the Town's daytime population by industry.

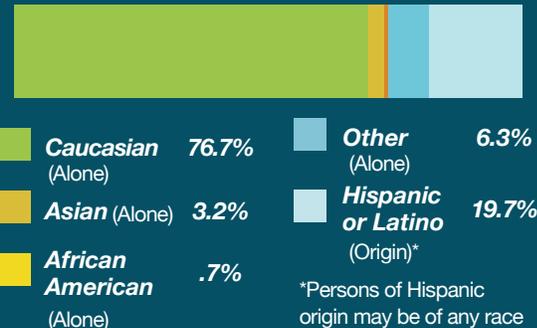

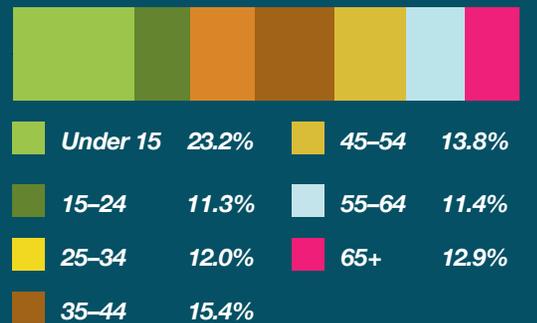

Water and Sewer Rates

The Town of Frederick provides water and stormwater service throughout the east side of I-25 and Left Hand Water District provides service on the west side of I-25. Water supply is also provided by Central Weld County Water District. Sewer service is provided by the St. Vrain Sanitation District.

Commercial Water Rates

A multi-tiered rate structure (\$2.59 to \$7.67 per 1,000 gallons, depending on consumption levels) is in effect, with the breakpoint dependent on the meter size. A monthly base cost is also assessed based on meter size.

Commercial Storm Water Rates

A monthly fee of \$39.58 or \$52.38 per acre is assessed on industrial and commercial land, respectively.

Raw Water System

The Town's 2021 Municipal Water Efficiency Plan (WEP) provides an update to the Town's 2011 Water Conservation Plan and will work in conjunction with other ongoing planning efforts currently being implemented by the Town. As part of these efforts, the Town is committed to reducing the water demand of future projects throughout the town, while at the same time recognizing the inherent need for water capacity that comes along with future development opportunities.
